The positions are permanent full-time. Employment is planned to start on 1 August 2025 or as soon as possible thereafter.

As a Professor at the Department of Public Health, you will be part of an ambitious and internationally recognised department, where we collaborate to advance public health through research focused on the promotion of health and the prevention, treatment and alleviation of disease. We engage in broad collaborations internally and externally, sharing our knowledge with citizens, decision-makers, public and private sector businesses, and other researchers nationally and internationally.

You will have approximately 200 colleagues at the department, including 80 academic staff members and a similar number of PhD students. Job Responsibilities

With your excellent collaborative skills and your broad academic network, you will enhance academic development at Aarhus University and development of the university's profile nationally and internationally.

Your main tasks will be:

- To do research at a high international level, including publications in top international journals and publishers, and communicating your research in national and international academic networks.
- To attract substantial external funding to support the activities of your research group.
- To collaborate on your research with private and public-sector stakeholders as well as research-based consultancy.
- To develop international networks and collaborations in research and teaching.
- To teach, supervise and examine Bachelor's and Master's degree students.
- To supervise PhD students and contribute to the development of the faculty's PhD courses.
- To contribute to assessment and committee work at Aarhus University and elsewhere.
- To disseminate your research to the public.
